

IN DEFENSE OF THE TREES.

The Pryor Street Case Was Argued Yesterday Before Judge Lumpkin.

The injunction of R. H. Holliday and others against the city in the matter of the Pryor street trees was taken up before Judge Lumpkin yesterday morning and when court adjourned yesterday afternoon argument had not been completed.

Sometime ago, when it was decided to place brick in the street and put down new sidewalks on Pryor street, it was also suggested that the trees be cut down. A number of residents who possessed fine trees objected. They enjoined the city and declared that the trees were valuable and they would not have them cut down.

Affidavits were introduced by the advocates of the trees to show that trees are healthful and that they should be allowed to remain. Messrs. Jack Spalding and Tom Corrigan represent the tree side, and Judge Anderson and Mr. Fulton Colville represent the city,
